On March 11, 240 guests joined Beyond Blindness for the sixth annual Vision Beyond Sight Gala, an evening that helped create an even brighter, bolder future for children and families in Orange County. Held at Marconi Automotive Museum in Tustin, the event raised close to \$253,000. Funds raised at the gala will play a key role in advancing Beyond Blindness' new strategic plan, which will be used as a roadmap for the next five years of expanding innovative early intervention, education and enrichment, and family support programming.
